

Minutes of Meeting of Membership
National Gymnastics Judges Association
April 2, 1971

A meeting of the Membership of the NGJA was held at Webers Inn, Ann Arbor, Michigan, on the second day of April, 1971 at 10:35 A.M. Present were: Ron Barak, Frank Cumiskey, Grady Matthews, Ted Muzyczko, Bill Roetzheim, and Jerry Wright. Absent was: Rick Field. Bill Roetzheim and Ted Muzyczko reviewed the actions taken the night before by the Board and indicated that elections of officers and directors would take place prior to August 1, 1971 for terms commencing October 15, 1971.

Bill Roetzheim reported that all FIG cards will expire on August 31, 1971, except for those cards received in Rome, Italy. The next FIG course will apparently be held in Spain, with no further information available at this time.

Bill further reported that no allowances have been made for a judge from the United States for the upcoming European tour, or the World Cup and for the National AAU championships. The final selection of these judges are to be made by April 15, 1971. Judges participating at either the Pan American Games or on the European tour must be available from approximately July 15, 1971 to August 10, 1971. Teams will be selected at Penn State on July 15-17, 1971. The first team will make the European tour and the second team will participate in the Pan American games. No further information was available at this time in connection with the World Cup, although it was later indicated that the NGJA will supply two to three Judges.

It was decided that the judge selected to go to the Pan American games will be in charge of all judges meetings, discussions and assignments at the tryouts at Penn State. The NGJA technical committee will gather and rank nominees for these foregoing assignments, final approval to be made by the Board. Frank Cumiskey in the east, Ted Muzyczko in the mid-east, Grady Matthews or Lou Barretta in the mid-west and Jerry Wright in the west were charged with the responsibility of coordinating the nominations.

With respect to the National AAU championships, Tom Maloney indicated that the AAU would provide \$1,000.00 for ten judges, to be selected by the NGJA. It was decided that such selection would be on a geographical basis and that the money made available by the AAU would be divided \$400.00 for two judges from the west, \$100 for three judges from the mid-west, \$100 for three judges from the mid-east and \$400 for two judges from the east. Pan American Games compulsory exercises will be used for this competition.

There being no further business to come before the meeting, upon motion duly made, seconded and unanimously carried, the meeting was adjourned.
